

The house was constructed in 1886 by Henry L. Smith, a local brick maker and first resident of the house. T. L. Buckland occupied the structure from 1908 to 1918 and was followed by Arthur Hamball, the manager for Neenah-Papishaw Co Cold Storage Company, who lived there until 1923. It was the home for Claude M. Barrett, the son of Ted Barrett, until 1961.
